Federal Trade Commission Completes Review

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DaVita Inc. announced today that the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) has completed its review of DaVita's acquisition of Gambro Healthcare U.S. and has issued a consent order allowing for the closing of the acquisition. The terms of the consent order require DaVita to divest sixty-seven dialysis centers within ten days, and three centers within 60 days, of the completion of its acquisition of Gambro. DaVita has entered into definitive agreements to sell all of the centers required to be divested. This includes the sale, as previously announced, of substantially all of the required divestitures to Renal Advantage, Inc. DaVita expects to complete the closing of the Gambro acquisition in early October and the required divestitures within the prescribed timeframe contained in the order.
